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Special Olympics Pennsylvania to Host Pittsburgh's Second Annual UNcathlon

Event Raises over \$50,000 for Pennsylvania Athletes Through Unified Sports

Pittsburgh, PA (April 17, 2018) – Special Olympics Pennsylvania (SOPA) will host the second annual Pittsburgh UNcathlon from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Sunday, April 22nd at Schenley Park, located at 1 Overlook Drive, Pgh, PA 15217. The UNcathlon will offer 11 events, one more than the traditional 10 found in a decathlon, and feature physical challenges with fundraising accounting for the 11th challenge. The event will bring persons with and without intellectual disabilities together in Unified Sports to benefit nearly 20,000 Special Olympics athletes.

The UNcathlon will involve several co-ed teams of five participants plus a Special Olympics athlete. Each team will take part in 10 physical trials that test speed, strength and endurance. Challenge events will include pull ups, shot put, the 40-yard dash, 400 meter run, 800 meter run, Weighted Bear Crawl sled drag, 2 x 200 meter relay, long jump, 500 meter row, and a mystery event. The 11th event will be the fundraising component that participants complete prior to engaging in the sporting events.

The UNcathlon was initiated by Pittsburgh resident Shannon Barry, who had always dreamed of creating a national awareness fundraising campaign to bring recognition to a cause. Shannon's vision was to incorporate unified play with unconventional fun for an unforgettable experience; and thus, the UNcathlon was born.

This year's event will be hosted by local DJ and Fireside Entertainment owner Eric Burnette. Other guest speakers to include Pittsburgh District 5 Councilman, Corey O'Conner; Special Olympics Pennsylvania President and CEO, Matthew Aaron; and Port Authority Police Chief, Matt Porter.
